

DACA Renewal—Checklist

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- ▶ Application must ARRIVE at USCIS by October 5, 2017; so send your application using FedEx or United States Postal Office Express or Priority Service
- ▶ If you have had any encounters with law enforcement since submitting your initial DACA application, even if it's only an arrest—speak to an attorney before sending in your renewal
- ▶ If you left the United States after August 15, 2012 and did not have advance parole—speak to an attorney before sending in your renewal
- ▶ DO NOT send in a first time application; only a renewal application

What You Should Bring

- A copy of your original DACA application and any prior renewal applications
 - Be sure to bring copies of the documents you attached to your DACA application
- A copy of your current Employment Authorization Card and any prior Employment Authorization Cards
 - The copies should include the front and back of the card
- A copy of your social security card
- 2 passport photos
- Copies of identification documents you use such as school identification cards, passports, driver's licenses, matricula consular, border crossing card
- A list of every address where you have lived and the dates you lived there since your initial DACA
- Fill out the following forms—we will review them with you at the workshop
 - Form I-821D
 - Form I-765 worksheet
- A check or money order for \$495 made out to the “Department of Homeland Security”

Bring these documents if the situations on the reverse side apply to you:

- Copies of any Advance Parole documents you received and the dates you travelled outside of the country (see reverse side)
- Copies of any arrest records, police reports, court papers (see reverse side)
- Copies of any papers related to deportation proceedings you have been in or are in now (see reverse side)

DACA Renewal—Documents for Special Circumstances

If you fall within any of these special circumstances, you will need to bring additional documents:

- ▶ You have had any encounters with law enforcement (even an arrest) since you submitted your first DACA application
- ▶ You have travelled outside the United States since August 15, 2012
- ▶ You have been put into deportation proceedings since you received DACA the first time or you still have an open deportation case in immigration court

Special Situation	Documents to Bring
Law Enforcement Encounters	Copies of tickets, citations, court documents like indictments, charges, judgments, plea agreements
Travel Outside the United States	List of dates that you travelled outside of the United States, copies of any exit or entry stamps on your passport, copies of any advanced parole documents you used to travel
Deportation Proceedings	Copies of documents related to the deportation proceedings: Notice to Appear, any documents issued by the Immigration Court, including removal orders or adm, any decisions from the Board of Immigration Appeals or a Federal Circuit Court of Appeals
